Enforced the 14th Amendment by guaranteeing all citizens of the United States the rights afforded by the Constitution and provided legal protection under the law. Passed by the 42nd Congress (1871-1873) as H.R. 320. Civil Rights Act of 1875: 18 Stat 335-337: Barred discrimination in public accommodations and on public conveyances on land and water.

The US Constitution guarantees a number of rights and liberties to US citizens. The right to trial by jury in criminal cases is guaranteed. (Article 3, Section 2) The citizens of each state are entitled to the privileges and immunities of the citizens of every other state.

Rights and Liberties in the Constitution

The first 10 amendments comprise the Bill of Rights. 1st Amendment. Ensures the five basic freedoms: freedom of religion, freedom of speech, freedom of the press, freedom to assemble and freedom to petition the government to remedy ("redress") grievances. 2nd Amendment.

Also passed in 1868 was the Fourteenth Amendment, which guaranteed civil rights to all citizens of the United States. In 1870, further advances in civil rights occurred when the 15th Amendment was passed ensuring all citizens the right to vote regardless of skin color.

The Commerce Clause basis for civil rights legislation prohibiting private discrimination was important because of the understanding that Congress's power to act under the Fourteenth and Fifteenth Amendments was limited to official discrimination. 950 The Court's subsequent determination that Congress is not necessarily so limited in its power reduces greatly the importance of the Commerce Clause in this area. 951
